Preface

This is the second edition of CSA Standard CAN/CSA-C309, *Performance Requirements for Glass-Lined Storage Tanks for Household Hot Water Service*. This Standard covers electrically, gas-fired, and oil-heated storage tanks. It supersedes the first edition published in August 1977.

Dimensions have been converted to SI (metric) units, which values shall be the standard. The yard-pound (Imperial) units given in parentheses are provided for information only.

This Standard was prepared by the Technical Committee on Electrical Storage-Tank Water Heaters under the jurisdiction of the Standards Steering Committee on the Performance of Electrical Products and was formally approved by these Committees. It has been approved as a National Standard of Canada by the Standards Council of Canada.
